- There are NO refunds or returns on HIFA tickets. (In the event of a cancellation or a rescheduled performance, HIFA will offer to exchange tickets for other performances.)
- Please ensure you have the correct tickets BEFORE leaving the counter. No refunds or exchanges will be issued once you have left the Box Office. Make sure you check for double booking of shows.
- You will NOT be admitted into a HIFA show if you are late. Please be punctual and allow enough time to get to the various venues. Factor in traffic and parking when you purchase firkets
- Please check your tickets before you present them at the venue and ensure you provide the correct ticket for the right show. HIFA will not replace or reissue another ticket.
- Damaged/lost tickets will not be accepted /replaced at venues or the Stanbic Bank iWayAfrica Portnet Corporation HIFA Box Offices.
- Children under 5 do not need a ticket unless they will be occupying a seat in a venue.
- Please note members of the public enter the HIFA site at their own risk. HIFA will not be held responsible for injury or damage to/loss of property.
- HIFA reserves the right of admission and the right to remove unruly members of the public from the HIFA site and venues.

SHOW TIME TIPS

TIPS FROM A FESTIVAL GURU...



NO READMITTANCE

on't forget that if you leave a venue during a performance you will not be re-admitted until the show is finished. This applies to all venues including Telecel Main Stage.

EARLY BIRDS

Book in advance for the shows you want to see. Popular artists will sell out! Use the programme, the website and the facebook page to work out the schedule of shows you want to see well in advance, then GO AND BUY YOUR TICKETS!

TIME IS OF THE ESSENCE

Shows at HIFA start on time, so be punctual to avoid being turned away! Arrive ahead of the pack, as stragglers will not be admitted once shows have begun.

Remember that HIFA doesn't do refunds, so give yourself enough time to experience the acts you want to see or hear.

SHHHHHHI

Audiences are there to hear the music, not a chorus of ringtones, so make sure your cell phones are switched off! At the indoor shows, stay in your seats and keep quiet.

BE WARM

The evening shows at Telecel Main Stage, Lay's Global Stage and Coca-Cola Green can get a bit chilly, so dress warmly! It is late autumn/early winter in Zimbabwe and so cool evenings, possible rain and cold winds are expected.

ARE YOU SITTING COMPORTABLY?

Feel free to bring along chairs and picnic blankets to appropriate Telecel Main Stage shows. To avoid confusion and sightline problems, those with chairs must find a spot on the right side of the grass arena facing the stage, whilst their lower lying, picnicking companions sitting on the grass should keep to the left of the arena. Be warned that some shows will attract large standing audiences so leave chairs, picnics and blankets at home and feast on the atmosphere instead.







This prestigious group of African Music Showcases brings together like minded festivals from the Continent in order to strengthen the promotion of African artistic industries. The organisation also supports the very exciting cultural tourism initiative, THE FIREFEST ROUTE (Southern African Festival Tour Circuit) of which HIFA is now a member. Spearheaded by Jiggs Thorne, Director of the Bushfire Festival in Swaziland, this renowned festival 'route' encompasses HIFA as its starting festival, and then moves on to A7GO festival in Manuto, BLACKMAIOR festival in South Africa, MTN BUSHFIRE festival in Swaziland and finally, SAKIFO MUSIK festival in Reunion Island. HIFA looks forward to increasing networking opportunities for Zimbabwean artists to engage with these great festivals.

In partnership with Pamberi Trust and the African Music Festivals Network, HIFA will be able to have the first use of a brand new sound system that will also travel between nominated festivals in the region.

The Ogreling is a beautifully conceived play for children and the young at heart, written by celebrated French-Canadian Playwright, Suzanne Lebeau and adapted within a Southern African context by Yvette Hardie, designed by Illka Louw, with puppets by Daya Heller. 
















HIFA IS COMMITTED TO BEING A CARBON NEUTRAL EVENT.


